Business Advocacy

2019 was a significant year for making waves at the state capitol in regards to business advocacy, and our Chamber continued the goal of fostering a climate that supports business and work force growth as well as retention. Trade with Canada and Mexico supports 12 million American jobs and is vital to businesses of every size, sector, and region. This is why, in October, The Coalition of East Tarrant Chambers traveled to Washington, D.C. and added it's voice to the U.S. Chamber advocating for Congress to pass the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement. The Business Advocacy goal team have responsibilities that include government relations, issues identification, identifying collaboration opportunities and ensuring Chamber members always have a "seat at the table." Major Events

There were 4 major events that the HEB Chamber provided to our members this year.
